

### **Financial Policy**

Neuropsychological evaluation is billed on a per hour basis to include both time spent with or without the patient in the initial exam, testing, scoring, interpretation, report writing, consultation, review of records, and feedback session. Depending on the type of evaluation, total hours billed may range from one to approximately fifteen hours. Specific information regarding fees may be requested prior to the evaluation.

Drs. Palmer and Dunn are Medicare providers, and accept Medicare assignment. If you are covered by Medicare, you will need a prescription from your primary care provider for a neuropsychological evaluation.
